### A Vision Brought to Life

The 1st Onsite Biography Gathering in India represented a milestone, bringing together enthusiasts, practitioners, and scholars of biography work under one unified vision. After years of anticipation, this dream finally materialized in September 2025 in the picturesque town of Puducherry, captivating fusion of Eastern Spirituality and Western Heritage. This coastal haven, blessed by the presence of Sri Aurobindo and The Mother, serves as the spiritual foundation for Auroville's experimental township dedicated to united conscious living.

The gathering commenced with the quintessential Indian welcome, participants were greeted with traditional Aarthi ceremonies and adorned with delicate sea shell necklaces, immediately immersing everyone in the warm embrace of Indian hospitality. Once settled into their accommodations, participants joined the opening session by Karl-Heinz's masterclass: Faith, Love & Hope – Building Resilience for Challenging Times. This powerful introduction set the tone for five days of the Gathering.

### Rituals @ Dawn & Daily Rhythms

The venue for the gathering RKN Resort offered many self-reflective spaces that created a sacred foundation for each day's explorations. Each morning began with the soul-stirring experience of watching the Sunrise along with walks on the beach, accompanied by the melodious chiming of temple bells and chirping of the birds, creating a unique symphony in itself





Our mornings were further enriched through mindful Meditation Sessions which included guided Chakra Meditations and Active Serpent Visualizations, helping participants center themselves for the intensive learning ahead.

Every day followed a beautiful rhythm: the ceremonial lighting of the lamp, followed by Karl-Heinz's profound masterclasses, and then engaging workshops led by contributors.















The workshop topics spanned an impressive range of subjects:

- · Introduction to Wombology
- · Creating a Shared Meaning of Hope
- · Resilience in the Age of Al
- · Sacred Seed: A Journey through the Living Laws
- · Applied Synchronicity
- · Photobiography Work: Seeing Whole, Making Visible
- · Building Resilience through Anthroposophic Medicine
- · Biographical Phases of Nutrition

These workshops weren't merely educational sessions, they were immersive experiences that invited participants to build resilience through multiple lenses, through creative activities and collaborative discussions that deepened understanding and fostered meaningful connections.

### **Evenings of Culture, Joy & Connection**

As day softened into evening, the gathering blossomed into a vibrant expression of culture and human connection. One unforgettable highlight was the Laughter Yoga session, where participants rediscovered their childlike wonder, filling the space with infectious joy and uninhibited laughter.

Another magical evening featured Tribal dancers whose graceful movements inspired participants to reveal their own hidden talents. The evening became an impromptu celebration as everyone joined in, creating a beautiful tapestry of movement exchange.





A particularly cherished experience was our Group Outing to explore Puducherry's vibe. Packed into two buses, the entire group journeyed through the charming streets, discovering local markets and savoring authentic regional cuisine, an adventure that added layers of cultural richness to our shared experience.

### **Concluding the Gathering**

As the themes of Faith, Love, and Hope wove an intricate tapestry through all the days, we finally arrived at the last day of the Gathering. On the fifth day, we concluded with yet another beautiful and insightful lecture on Faith by Karl-Heinz.

AHBW also took this opportunity to share its vision and future plans with all the participants. We expressed our heartfelt gratitude to the volunteers by presenting them with mementoes, and to the participants with certificates made on palm leaf & group photograph as a cherished keepsake of our time together.

We bid farewell to some who were returning home while others continued on a four-day excursion to explore the profound cultural and spiritual heritage of the region.





### The Heritage and Spiritual Excursion

Our heritage exploration began with a Heritage walk through Puducherry's historic quarters. We visited the fascinating Puducherry Museum, which houses an extraordinary collection of archaeological artifacts, sculptures, and colonial-era memorabilia that narrate the town's unique Franco-Tamil legacy. The Church of the Sacred Heart of Jesus captivated us with its stunning Gothic Revival architecture, intricate stained glass windows, and peaceful ambience reflecting the town's multicultural spiritual heritage.

Walking through the French Quarter's cobblestone streets, we encountered beautifully preserved colonial buildings with their distinctive yellow facades and charming balconies, each structure whispering stories of Puducherry's cosmopolitan past. We also explored the Aurobindo Ashram. It was a deeply calming and transformative experience. The atmosphere was quiet yet vibrant with a gentle energy that seemed to encourage introspection and stillness.

### **Auroville: Humanity's Experimental Dream**

Our journey to **Auroville** was transformative. At the heart of this international township stands the magnificent **Matrimandir a golden spherical temple** that serves as a symbol of the Divine's presence on Earth. Inside this architectural marvel, we participated in **silent meditation sessions** within the crystalline inner chamber, experiencing profound moments of introspection. Together we explored **Sadhana Forest** – an innovative sustainable living community, witnessing firsthand their commitment to ecological harmony, renewable energy, and conscious living. The township's dedication to human unity, regardless of nationality, religion, or beliefs, resonated deeply with our gathering own spirit of inclusive biography work









### **Sacred Tiruvannamalai: of Light**

Our excursion concluded at the sacred town of Tiruvannamalai, nestled at the base of the holy Arunachala Hill considered one of India's most powerful spiritual centers. This ancient town, dedicated to Lord Shiva in his form as the element of fire, has attracted spiritual seekers for millennia.

We visited the magnificent Annamalaiyar Temple, one of India's largest temple complexes, with its soaring gopurams (temple towers) and intricate stone carvings that speak to centuries of devotion. The tradition of Girivalam: circumambulating the sacred Arunachala Hill, offered participants a moving spiritual experience. Visiting the Ramana Maharishi Ashram created an unforgettable finale to our journey. Visiting the Ashram at the foothills of Arunachala was a deeply quieting and inward-turning experience. There was a palpable stillness in the air—one that seemed to invite silence not as an absence of sound, but as a living presence.

#### **Farewell**

On our final day, as departure time approached, the emotional weight of separation became tangible. The connections forged over these transformative days had evolved far beyond professional networking, they had become authentic friendships rooted in shared purpose and mutual understanding.

Tearful farewells mingled with expressions of gratitude and promises to remain connected. As we returned to our respective corners of the world, we all parted with a silent agreement: this was **not an ending but a beginning**. The seeds planted during these extraordinary days in Puducherry would continue to grow, nurturing the global biography community until our reunion at the next **Indian Gathering in 2027**.

### **The Ripples of Intention**

After the catastrophic tropical cyclone storm Haiyan had passed, the living tapestry of the village stood still. The sea, once wild with wrath, now lay silent beneath the bruised sky. Its winds no longer screaming and its flood receding into silence. The storm had torn down the walls of homes and their memories. It was not just roofs, roads, and farmlands that lay in tatters, but the unseen landscapes of people's hearts as well.

But amid such silence, something began to stir.

A small group of parents—ordinary people with extraordinary hearts—gathered far from the disaster zone. Each came from different walks of life: a homemaker, artist, puppeteer, teacher, eurythmist, storyteller, and a theater artist. While they were not exactly trained for trauma work, all of them were moved by a common flame—a deep, urgent desire to help in whatever way they could. They believed that supporting healing can take many forms and is not limited to being carried out by registered local or international organizations. Support for healing can include singing lullabies to the younger children, bringing joy through movement, art, and games, singing, creating safe spaces, or simply listening and being present. They did not even have funding to begin with, but because the genuine intention and will to help were alive, somehow support came through their network and even from strangers who believed in their cause.

With stories, movement, art, and games in their pockets, and hearts wide open, the team went from one village to another.

They didn't come to fix or to lecture. They came with their warmth and presence to connect, move, and listen.

The team invited children to move again, not away from fear, but toward joy. Community halls rang with the sound of clapping games, improvised theater, and play with colors on canvas, as the community created music from natural materials found in the area. Parents shyly joined in as well. Laughter cracked the heavy air like sunlight. Through time, rhythm echoed—not just in the feet and hands, but in the spirit.

It wasn't a professional therapeutic intervention. It was an invitation.

An invitation to feel again. To remember that the soul has its resilient way of rebuilding.

What started with one team grew. Those who were moved by the team's simple act of kindness slowly began their creative initiatives, guided by free will and creativity. With the renewed energy of both the community that received the warmth and the team that took the courage to help, the one act started to inspire the others. The drop became a ripple, and the ripple a wave.

And the beauty of it all? You didn't have to be trained or polished. You only needed a heart that cared.

Some came with no skills, only the willingness to help—cooking, carrying water, gathering the debris, sweeping the floors, and holding a child's hand, to name a few. And that was more than enough. And perhaps, to some, that was everything



### Strengthening Resilience and Faith in Challenging Times, through community spiritual work

Over the past few years, as part of our response to the challenges of our contemporary era in Israel and around the world, starting with the pandemic period, we have placed increasing emphasis on creating a spiritual community that studies together, as well as on strengthening our faith – as the strongest "weapon" for building resilience. In this framework, we opened an international WhatsApp group of Strengthening Spiritual Biographical Messages, based on Anthroposophy and Jewish Kabbalah that were sent on a weekly basis, which recently developed into a working group of spiritual practice. We find that to work in an international group, which has a common spiritual language has great power. Following are some examples of the spiritual strengthening messages that were sent in the group, that are connected directly to the subject of Faith

### **Spiritual Strengthening Message – Faith / Orna Ben Dor**

Sometimes, when we are attacked by physical or mental pain, we experience our lives as if they were a sequence of painful events. We review life from birth to the present day, and wonder at all if we were ever happy. The event of age nine, the event of age 17, the events of all childhood and adolescence, are rising. And then all the other crises of adulthood – and the feeling is that this journey is hopeless.

Then, suddenly, we look at who we are today, and what a good place we have reached in our spiritual development, in our giving to the world – and realize that each event and event, painful as it may be, has added its share to our spiritual construction. So, we understand that real life happens on another level; below the surface. There our growth exists, there our connection to the Creator is strengthened.

The most difficult challenge is to bring faith into the difficult event. Not just when the event passes. To believe even in the pain that everything is happening right, and that even in the pain God is, and He sees past, present, future – the whole picture, that is hidden from our eyes.

And it's worth praying for – Give me the ability to see You in my pain; to know that You

are guarding me accurately, even though You are also guarding millions of other people at the same time – because for You, nothing is impossible; because You are infinite, because You are love itself, because You are the merciful father to his children.

And You promised – that one day we will all experience the immense pleasure of Your Light. And all the deliberations, the conflicts, the pains, will disappear as if they never existed — To all of us, without exception.

And we all know that you forgive all of us. 34 "And they shall teach no more every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying: 'Know the LORD'; for they shall all know Me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them, saith the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin will I remember no more." Jeremiah, 34

And that You will not out oust any of us from you, even if it seems to us that we have been abandoned. "We must all die, we are like water spilled on the ground, which cannot be gathered up again. But God will not take away life, and he devises means so that the banished one will not remain an outcast." 2 Samuel 14,14.

So just hold on; do not give up. Redemption is very near.

## Spiritual Strengthening Message What is the difference between philosophy and faith? or between philosophers and believers? Orna Ben Dor - Hotam School

Philosophers ask questions believers can understand; they ask similar questions. However, believers hold answers that philosophers can not comprehend. Why? because philosophers ask questions that concern matters that are beyond nature by providing answers that use human intelligence, that is tied to nature laws.

When I can explain something that is external to me, it means that I am separated from it. By adopting faith, one accepts the unity of opposites - faith enables me to sense the creator - the ultimate other - inside myself, not external to me. The creator thus turns from an abstract, distant object to a willful Being. I can sense within me God's will for me, as an invitation. God invites me to work with him in collaboration.

If we detach ourselves from faith, we only deal with our wisdom, which is forever limited!

Our faith must begin with believing in books that were written by initiated people with spiritual insight, and spiritual teachers. It requires submission, devotion and acceptance that there is something larger than me, from whom I wish to learn. As written in "Pirkei Avot" ('Ethics of the Fathers', in Hebrew): "Assume for yourself a master (acquire for yourself a friend, and judge every man to the side of merit.").

You are the one that creates your own teacher!

After finding a worthy teacher, you are the one who chooses to believe he\she will lead you on the right path. Without your doing, your teacher is merely a common person in the crowd. It is all up to you.

The modern mind of the 20th-21st century finds it hard to grasp. Our big ego thinks it knows better. It is unfitting for us to surrender. Especially as we regard ourselves as intelligent and intellectual, perhaps even more than the person we chose as a teacher.

Nonetheless, it is very important to understand that the teacher is only a means to connect, through discussions, books, learning and advice, to what is essentially ours from the start - the connection of my soul to its creator. Without such understanding the relationship between the student and teacher might turn out to be dangerous and harmful.

### On a personal note:

I was bestowed with a great teacher! He accompanied me through 25 years of my adult life. From the moment I found him, I did not let go! Hence, I slowly made him my teacher. At first, he did not realize that, but later on he understood. From that point onward, we have remained on the same path together. Even today, when he resides in the spiritual world, he still accompanies me and supports me and the stream of the Hotam school.


